Chairman Schmidt called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Public Comments – Paul Fogarty, regarding mosquito fish.

Vice-Chairman Ott moved, seconded by Trustee Greenwood that Warrants Numbered 36774 through 36805 totaling \$64,190.73 be approved for payment. The motion passed unanimously.

Dr. Wekesa read the Manager's Report for August 10, 2022 through September 13, 2022. Trustee Johnstad moved, seconded by Vice-Chairman Ott that the Manager's Report be approved and made a part of the minutes. The motion carried unanimously.

Dr. Wekesa informed the Board to consider two web page design companies, one is the current company the other is Streamline. The new website must be ADA complaint and allow the District to display aerial applications, disease surveillance data and enable residents to place online requests for service. Streamline meets all the required requirements and if approved will start work and be on board November. Trustee Johnstad moved, seconded by Vice-Chairman Ott to approve the website designer. The motion carried unanimously. Dr. Wekesa informed the Board Stanislaus County Treasury changed our checking account from Bank of the West to JP Morgan Chase and the Board acknowledged no need for motion or resolution.
